Curriculum Vitae of Stephen E. Moffat

Stephen Moffat was born in Montreal, Quebec. He enrolled in the Canadian Forces in September 1969 and attended le Collège Militaire Royale du Canada and The Royal Military College of Canada, graduating from the latter with a degree in Politics. He was commissioned as an Armour officer in Lord Strathcona's Horse (Royal Canadians), joining his regiment in Calgary in the summer of 1974.

He has served four tours in various command and staff positions with armoured regiments both in Canada and Germany, two each with the Strathcona's and The Royal Canadian Dragoons, and served as a tactics instructor at the Armour School. Whilst serving with The Royal Canadian Dragoons he did a short exchange with The Royal Horse Guards/Dragoons (The Blues and Royals) of the British Army.

He is a graduate of the Canadian Land Forces Command and Staff College in Kingston and the Canadian Forces Command and Staff College at Toronto.

After 14 years of continuous regimental or instructional duties, in 1988 he was posted to NATO's Central Army Group Headquarters in Heidelberg, Germany, first as Executive Officer to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations for a year and then two years as a War Plans Officer. Immediately following this tour of duty, he served for three years as the divisional plans officer at Headquarters 1st Canadian Division in Kingston, Ontario.

In 1992-93, he deployed to Somalia as the Chief Operations Officer (J3) for the Canadian Joint Forces Somalia and was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for his service on that mission.

Upon return from Africa Mr. Moffat was seconded for three years to the International Peace Academy (IPA) in New York, where he was employed as the Senior Associate for Training. On return to Canada in 1997, he took up his new duties in the Directorate of Peacekeeping Policy at National Defence Headquarters in Ottawa.

In July 1998 Mr. Moffat was seconded to the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade as the Head of the Peacekeeping Section in the Regional Security and Peacekeeping Division. Here he was involved at the senior policy level with all peace support operations undertaken by Canada and was intimately involved with Canada's tenure on the UN Security Council 1999-2000.

In 2001, he was posted to Vienna, Austria where he served as the Military Advisor for the Canadian Delegation to the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe and in 2004 he was sent to London, England, where he served for two years as Assistant and then Acting Army Attaché. His final year in service was as Canadian Liaison Officer to the UK Army Development, Concepts and Doctrine Centre in Wiltshire.

After almost 38 years of service to his country, Mr. Moffat retired from the Army in August 2007 to take up his current position as President of Suffield Industry Range Control, Ltd.

- Ensure safe interface between Oil & Gas activity and military training at Canadian Forces Base Suffield

Liaised with Industry Range Safety on an almost daily basis concerning all aspects of their day-to-day operations within the confines of the base.
