## Public Comments Invited Draft Project-Specific Guideline and Scoping Document Cameco Corporation – Proposed New Uranium Mine

Cameco Corporation is proposing to construct and operate a new underground uranium mine - the Millennium Project - north of its Key Lake Development. Cameco is required by the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment to conduct an environmental impact assessment of the proposed project. A draft Project-Specific Guidelines and Scoping Document has been prepared to assist Cameco with the environmental impact assessment.

The public is invited to comment on the document which incorporates both federal and provincial environmental assessment requirements. The document identifies key issues and studies required in Cameco's environmental impact assessment. Milling the ore and disposing of associated waste products are outside the scope of the Millennium Project and will be considered under separate environmental and regulatory approvals

## Deadline for comments is June 22, 2010.

(All submissions will be reviewed by both federal and provincial regulators.)
