## Cameco Corporation Key Lake Extension Public Comments Invited

Cameco Corporation is proposing to expand the storage capacity of the Dielmann Tailings Management Facility at Key Lake and increase the mill's throughput capacity. The project is subject to an environmental assessment under both <a href="https://example.com/The-Environmental-Assessment Act">The Environmental Assessment Act</a> (Saskatchewan) and the <a href="https://example.com/Canadian-Environmental-Assessment Act">Canadian Environmental Assessment Act</a> (Saskatchewan)

Cameco will be asked to consider that the project impacts may adversely affect Aboriginal and Treaty rights and the company may contact Aboriginal communities for their views. Aboriginal communities are encouraged to cooperate with Cameco in considering potential impacts and may contact the Ministry of Environment directly to provide information or express concerns. This information will be used by the ministry to implement its duty to consult obligations.

A draft project-specific guidelines scoping document has been prepared to assist Cameco with the environmental impact assessment.

The public is invited to comment on the document, which incorporates federal and provincial environmental assessment requirements and identifies the key issues and studies to be addressed in an environmental impact statement. All comments will be reviewed by provincial and federal regulators and will be considered public as part of the project file.

Interested individuals may view the document at First Nations, Métis Nation-Saskatchewan and northern community offices in the Athabasca region.
