Dear landowner,

KGHM International wants to inform you about an aerial magnetic survey that will be done in your area in early to late May.

We have contracted a firm to conduct detailed aeromagnetic surveying of KGHM International's mineral claims in and around the site of the proposed Ajax mine and to the southeast.

A helicopter fitted with a magnetic probe will fly parallel northeast lines 100 metres apart across the survey area (see attached map) at an altitude of approximately 30 metres above the topography. The helicopter will make one pass on each line. The probe measures only natural magnetic forces. The probe does not transmit a signal.

All flying will be done on weekdays, in daylight hours between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. It's expected the survey will take five to seven days to complete, dependent on the weather.

Some of the flying will take place across privately owned lands. The flight company will operate in accordance with regulated aviation and safety standards and will take every opportunity to minimize disruption around residences, outbuildings and equipment, or cattle.

The survey is required as KGHM International continues the work of planning for the Ajax Project. It is important that we delineate to the highest degree of accuracy the boundaries and nature of the mineral resources in our area. Part of that effort requires surveying well beyond the expected boundaries of the resource.

KGHM International wants to notify you of the survey in advance, to prevent unnecessary concern about the presence of the low-flying helicopter. If you have comments or concerns about the proposed survey, please call us at 250-374-5446.
