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Figure 7-1: Public Open House Comment Form Results: Fishing, Hunting and Harvesting

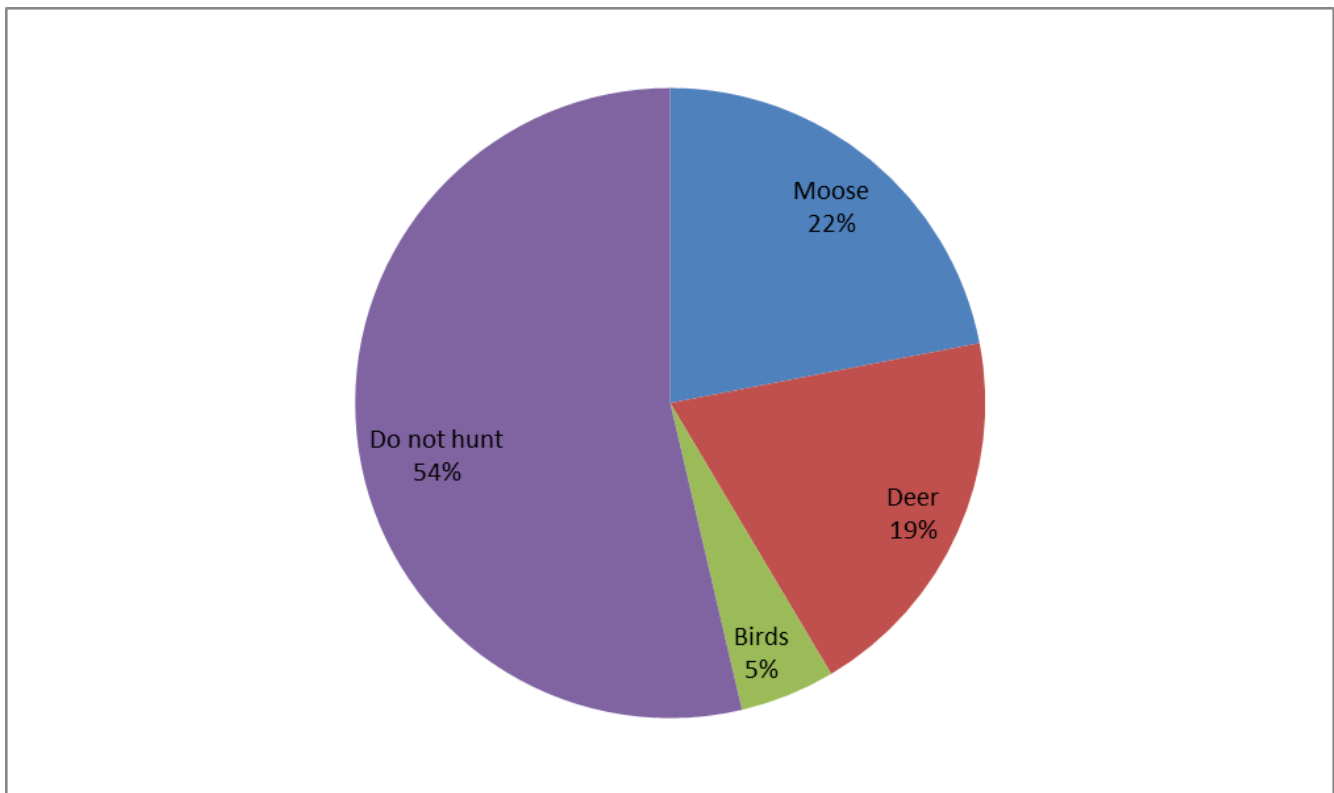


Figure 7-2: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: What types of animals do you hunt?

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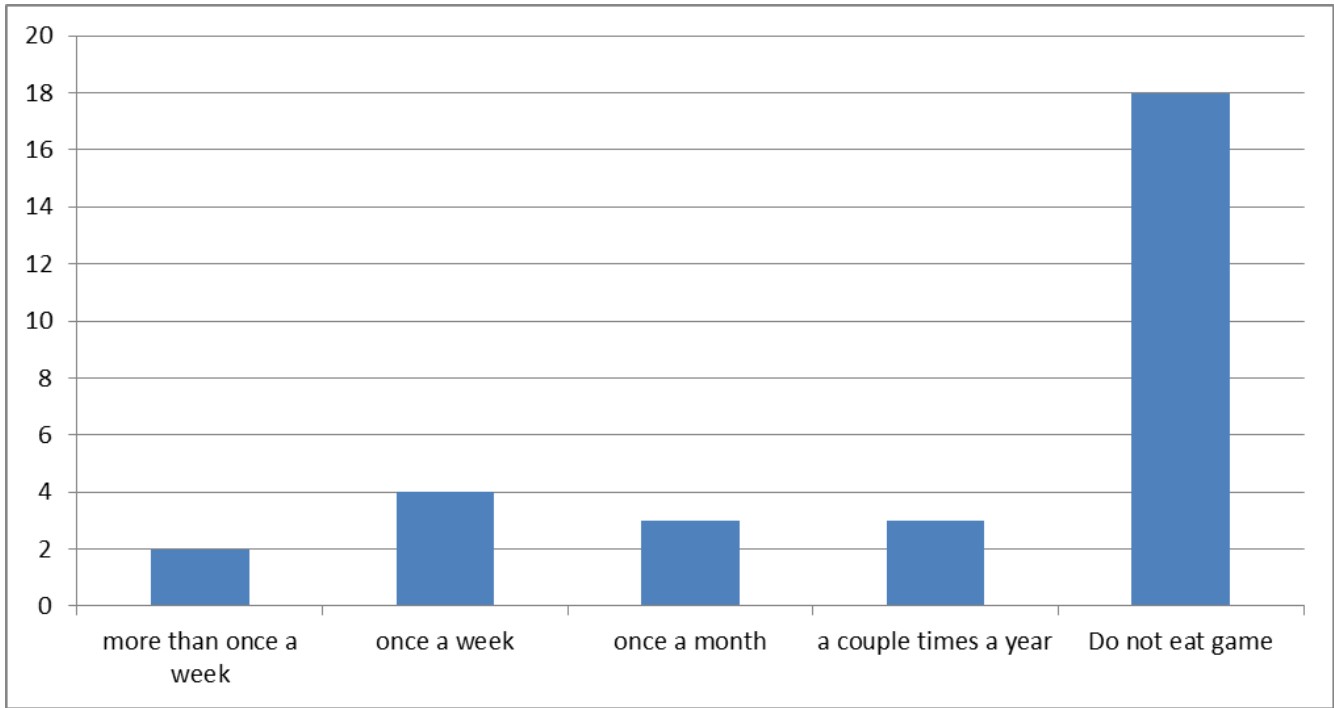


Figure 7-3: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: How often do you eat animals that you have caught?

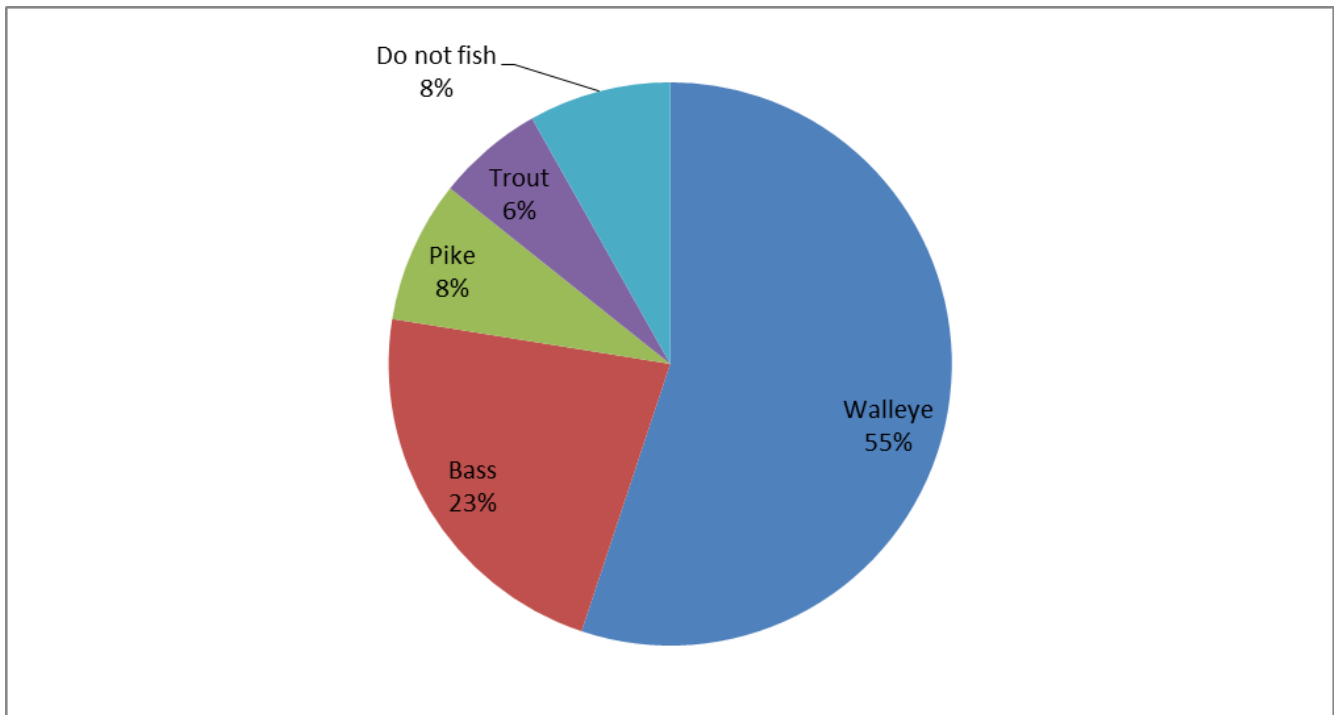


Figure 7-4: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: What types of fish do you catch?

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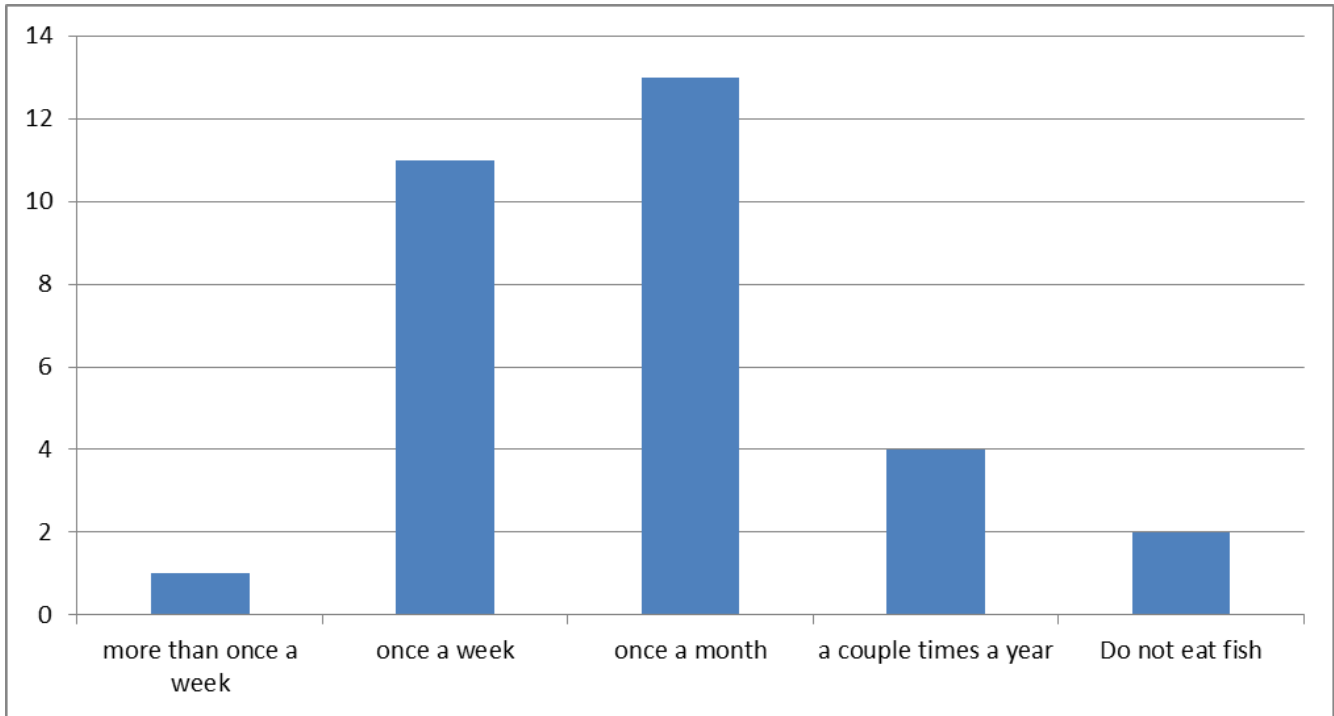


Figure 7-5: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: How often do you eat fish you have caught?

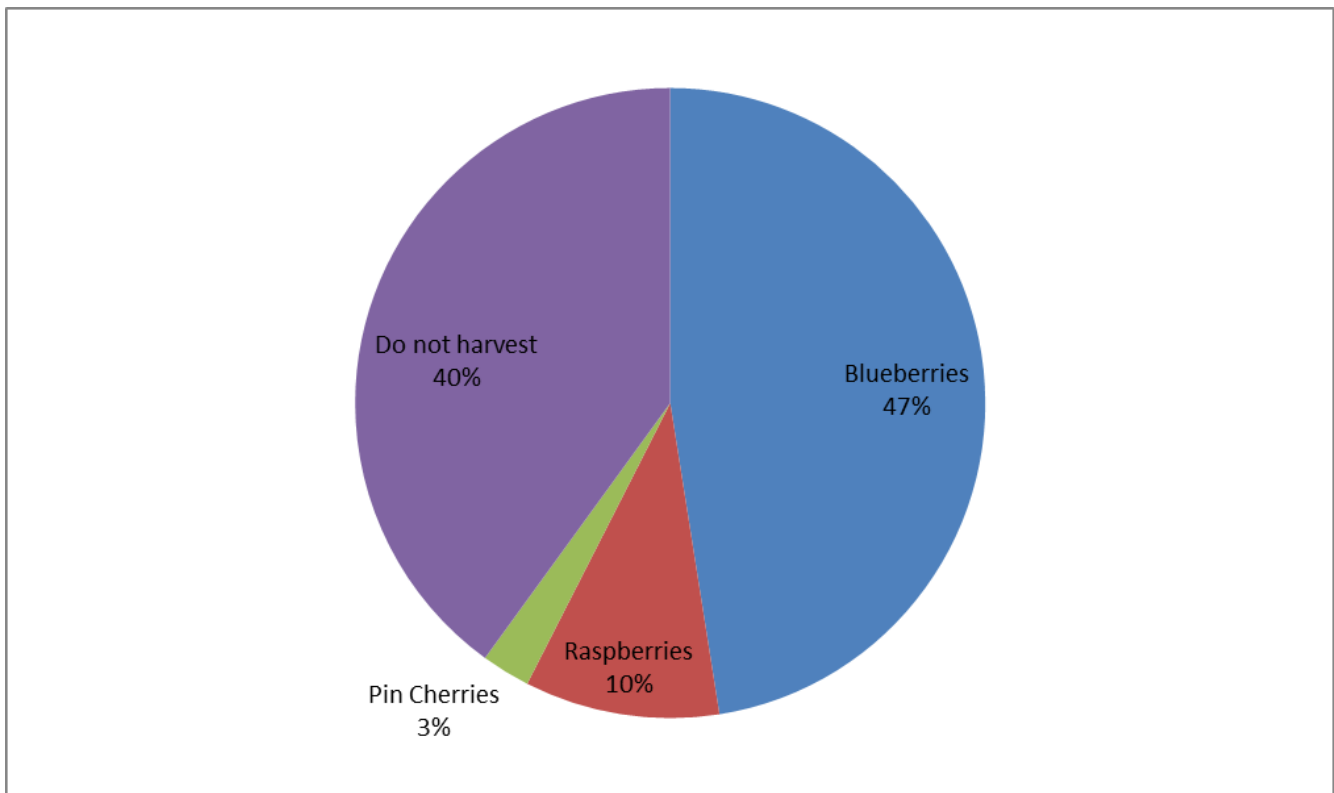


Figure 7-6: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: What types of plant/berries do you harvest?

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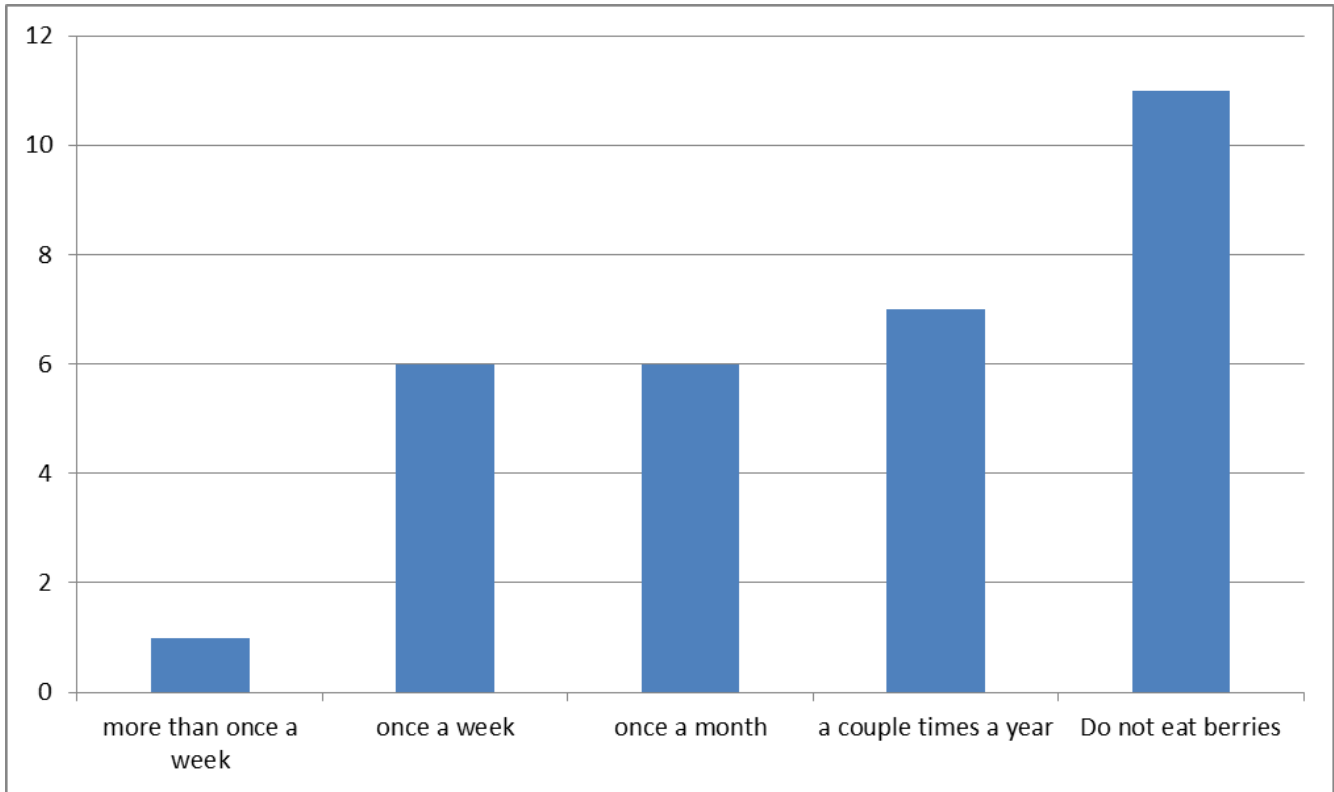


Figure 7-7: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: How often do you eat the plants you have harvested?

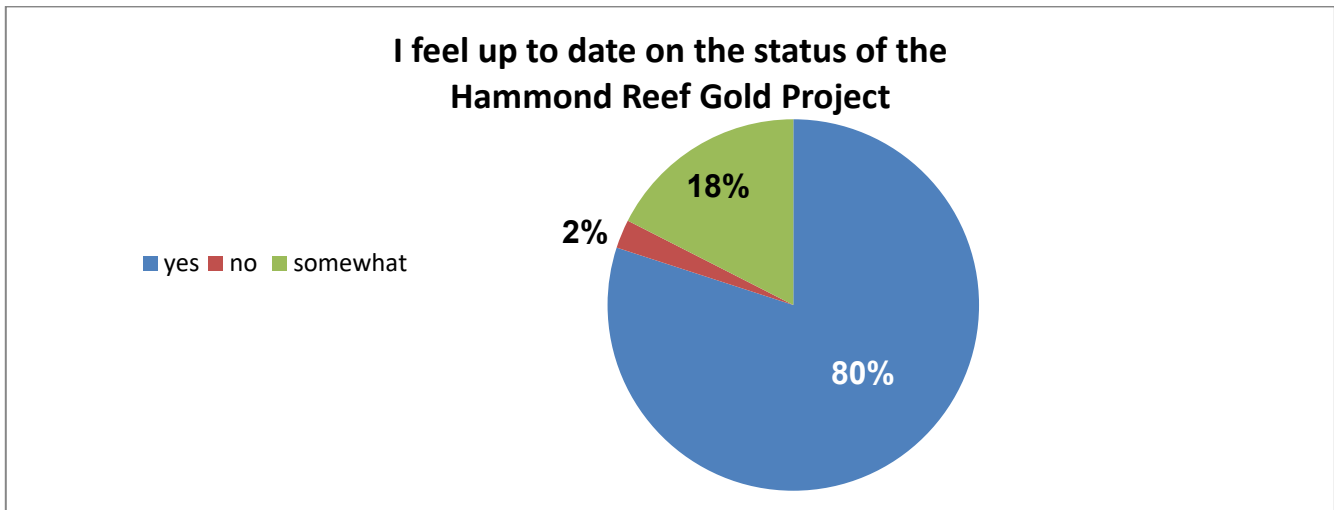


Figure 7-8: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: Project Information

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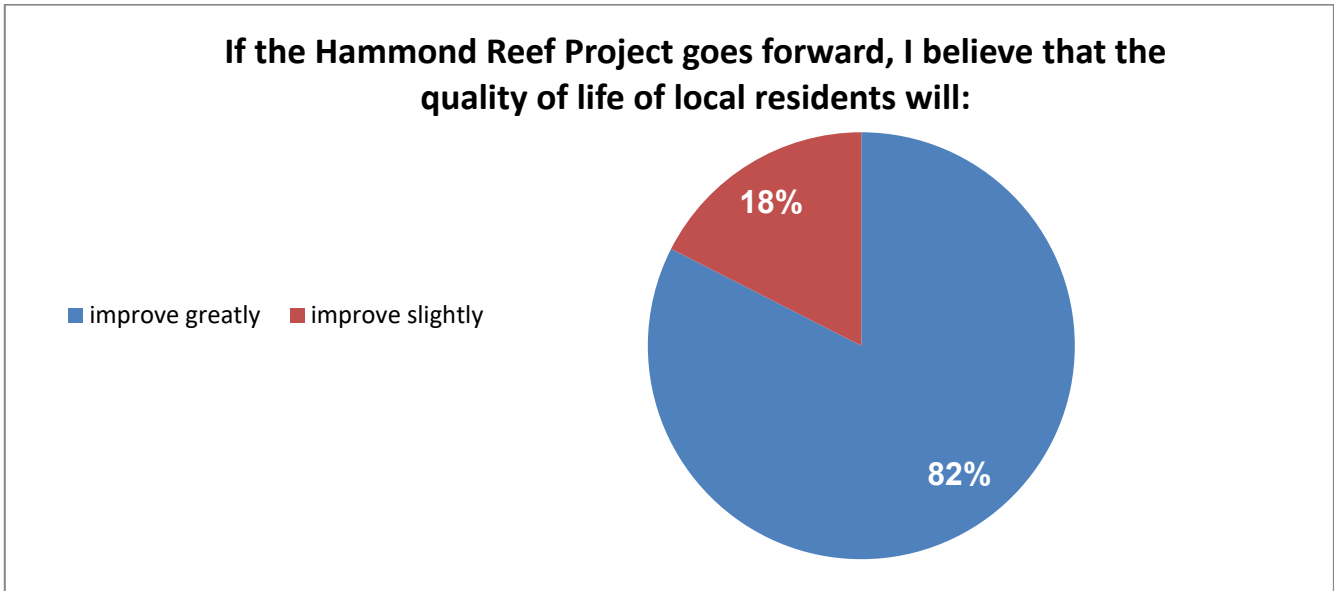


Figure 7-9: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: Project Information

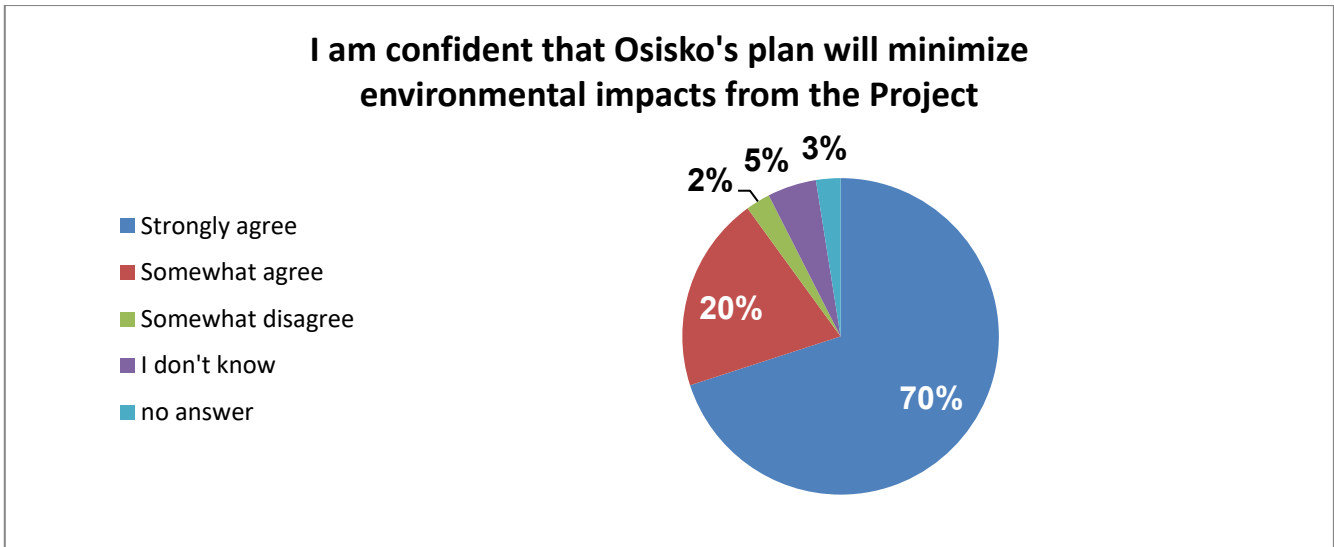


Figure 7-10: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: Planning to Minimize Environmental Impacts

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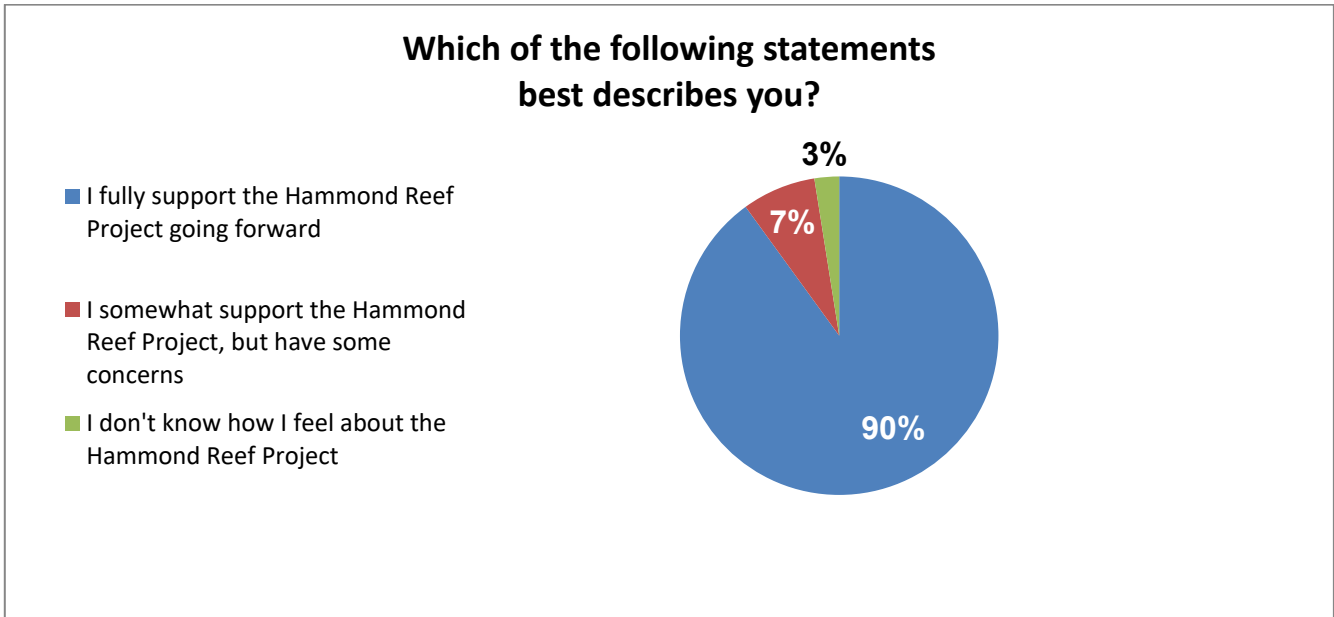
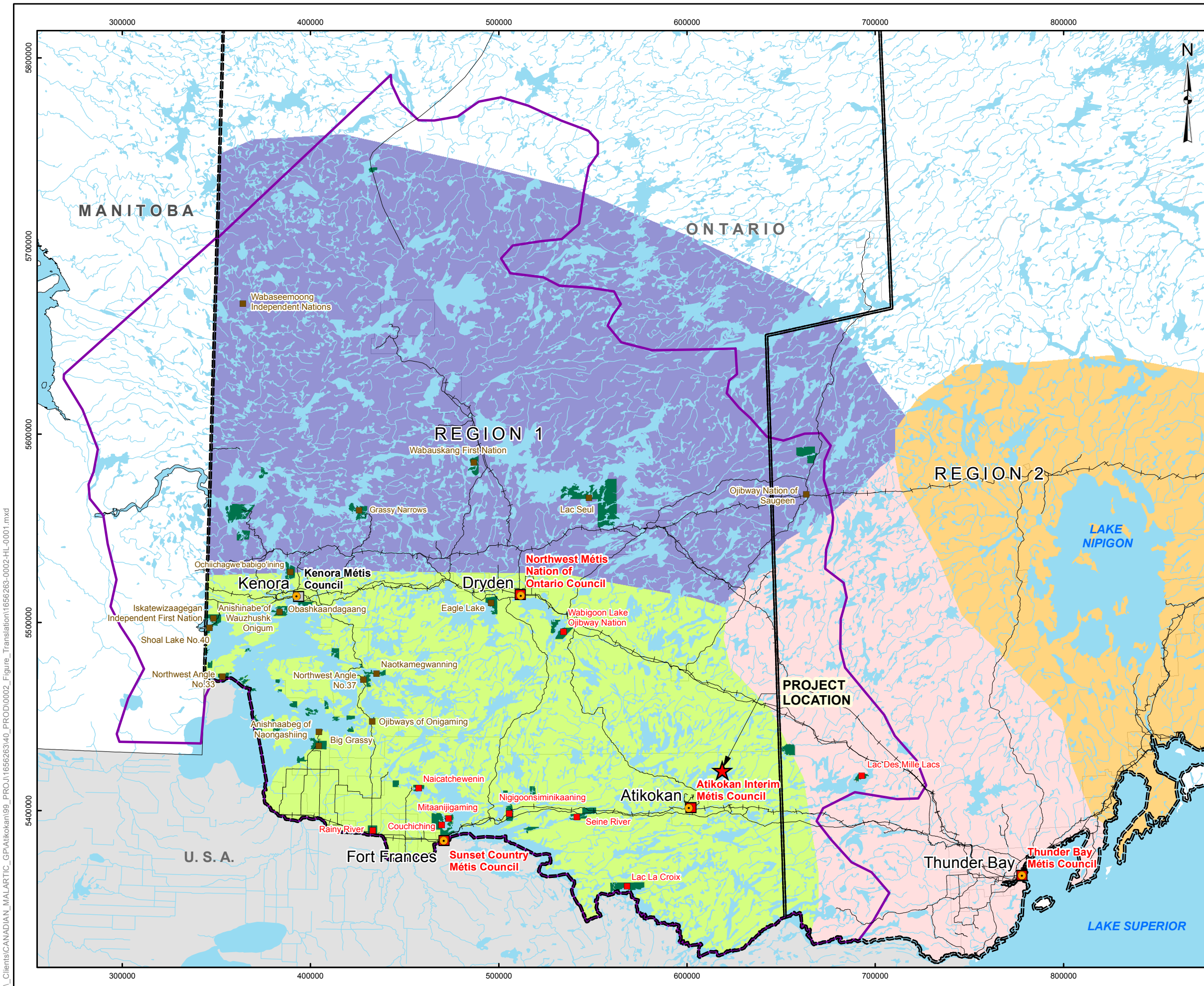


Figure 7-11: Public Open House Comment Forms Results: Support for the Project



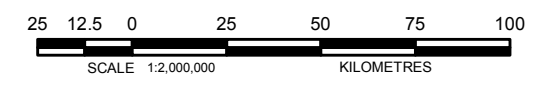

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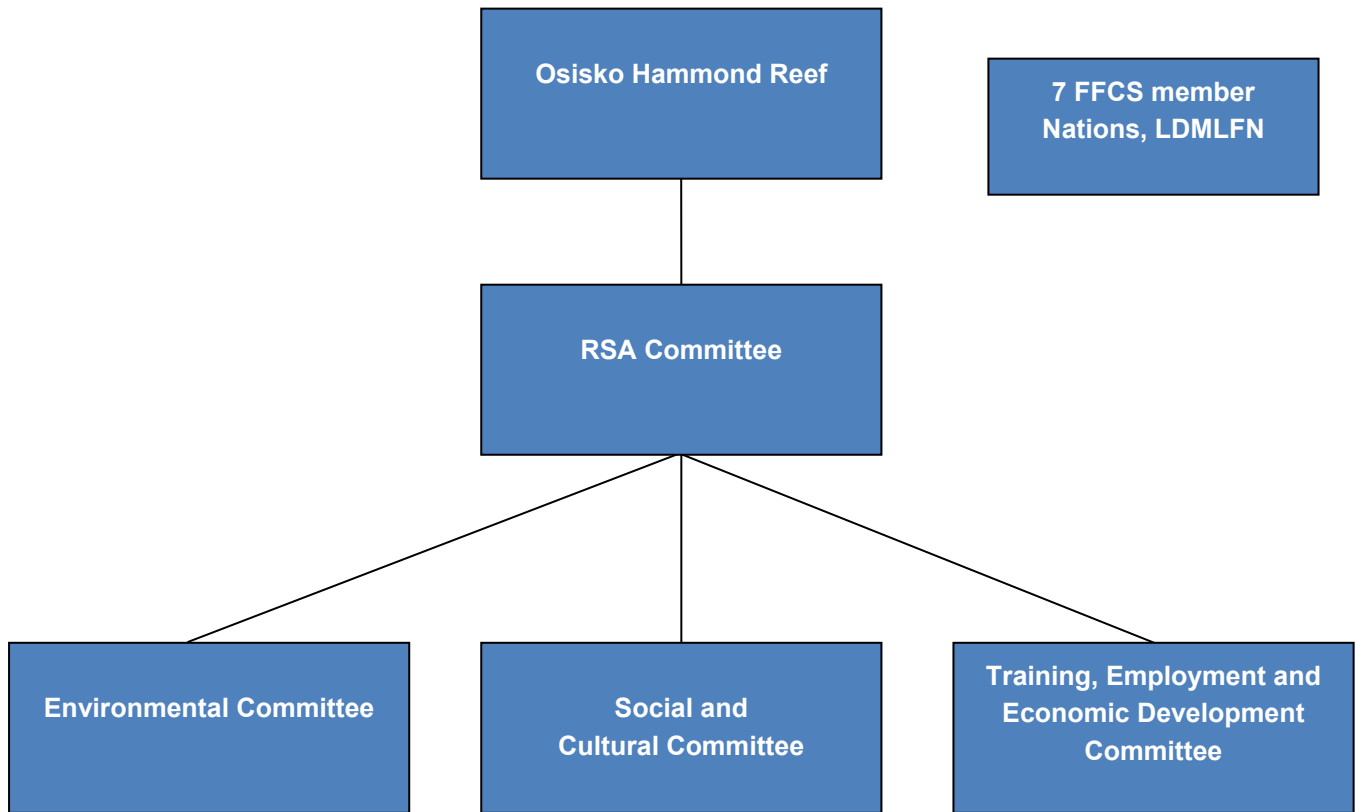


Figure 7-13: Established Resource Sharing Committees

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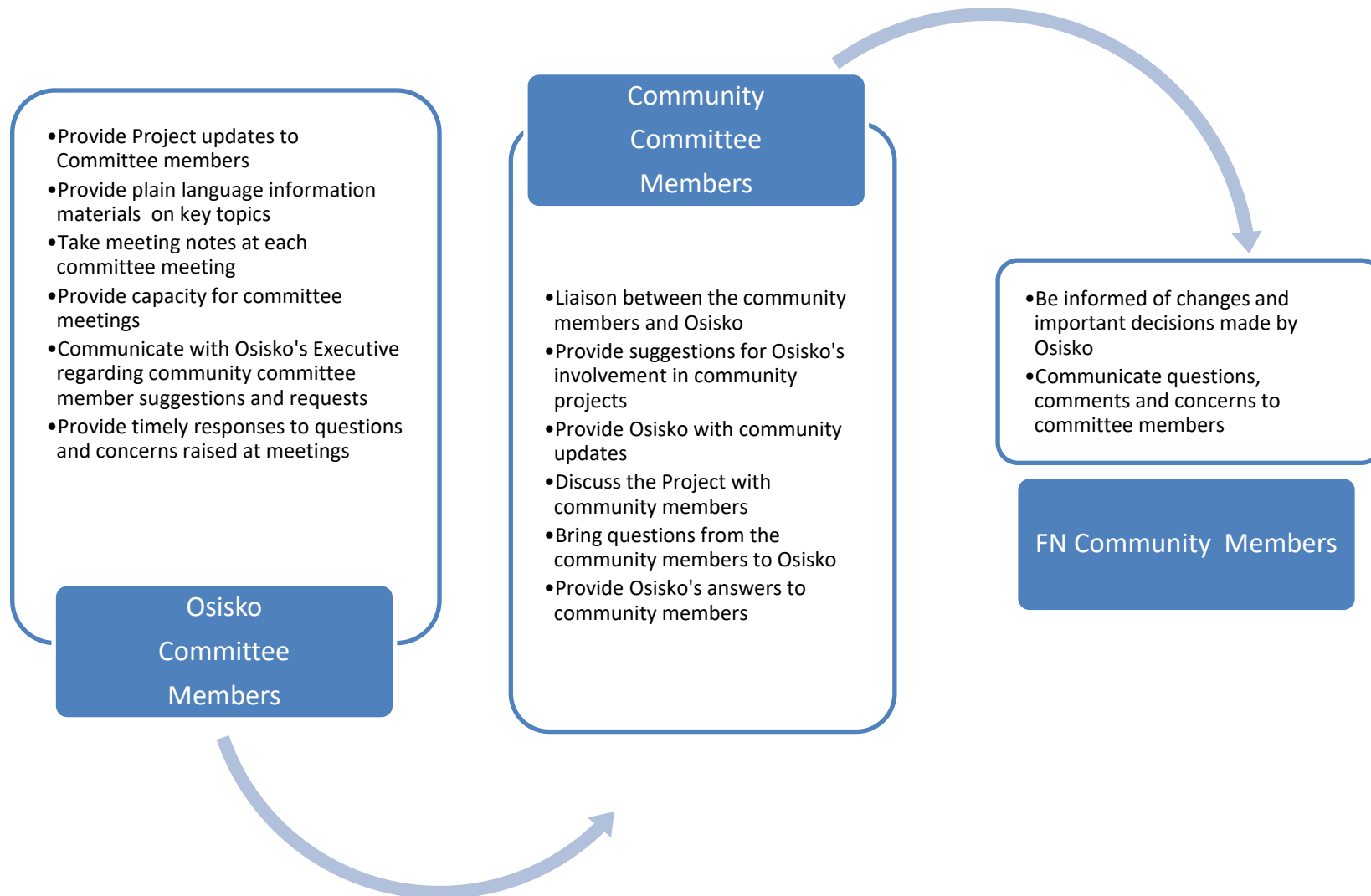


Figure 7-14: Resource Sharing Committee Communication Links
