For example, consideration will need to be given to providing more assessment to the siting location of the Worker Camp in regards to comments provided by members of the Government Review Team (GRT).	An alternatives assessment of 5 different possible locations for the Worker Camp was undertaken based on comments received. The evaluation of each alternative was based on environmental, social, technical and economic criteria. The goal was to locate the camp away from the shoreline but remain within the Project footprint. The new location is off the public road, respects a 120 m buffer zone from the shoreline and allows for a combined camp and mine water effluent discharge. The detailed Camp Alternatives Assessment is provided as Attachment 1 to the Final EIS/EA Report Addendum.	The Worker Camp Alternatives Assessment was conducted after the first formal inspection period for the EA and a new, preferred alternative has been chosen. Consultation on the camp location alternatives was conducted through meetings held in October 2015 with the. Mitaanjigamiing First Nation, the Fort Frances Chiefs and RSA committee members - Lac Des Mille Lacs FN, Seine River FN, and Lac La Croix FN, and in February 2017 with the Métis Nation of Ontario Region One, the Fort Frances Chiefs and Lac Des Mille Lacs First Nation and the Mayor and Council in Atikokan.
