Re: Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project Environmental Assessment

I am writing on behalf of the T'Sou-ke Nation ("T'Sou-ke") to advise that T'Sou-ke supports and consents to the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority's proposed Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project ("Project"), a marine container terminal which is currently being assessed for environmental effects.

T'Sou-ke understands that the container ships travelling to and from the proposed marine terminal are within our traditional territory.

T'Sou-ke acknowledges and agrees that we are satisfied with the mitigation measures provided by Vancouver Fraser Port Authority ("VFPA") in respect of the environmental effects of the Project and associated marine shipping, agrees that there has been adequate consultation in connection with and accommodation of the Project's impacts on its Aboriginal rights, title and interests and associated marine shipping and further supports the granting of each and every certificate, authorization and permit necessary for the Project and associated marine shipping.

T'Sou-ke, in consultation with the VFPA, will continue to identify concerns and make suggestions within the applicable regulatory processes to eliminate, manage, or mitigate effects to our Aboriginal rights, including title, and our Douglas Treaty Rights from the Project, provided that T'Sou-ke accepts the outcome of such processes or government initiatives and that such participation is undertaken in a timely and good faith manner to identify and mitigate potential impacts of the Project on T'Sou-ke's Rights and does not involve a position that there has been inadequate consultation or accommodation or have the effect of frustrating, hindering, delaying or increasing the costs of the Project.
