Subject: AHP Development Corporation - Amisk Hydroelectric Project

Thank you for your email of April 14, 2026, following up on our March 24, 2026, call regarding IAAC's intention to begin work on the Amisk Project and recover related costs from AHP Development Corporation starting in April 2026.

As noted during our March 24, 2026, discussion, AHP has submitted the Amisk Project to the Major Project Office for designation as a project of national interest and is currently awaiting a response. AHP also continues to engage actively with several Indigenous communities regarding potential Project partnerships.

AHP's Project schedule depends on establishing Indigenous partners prior to initiating social and environmental assessments, to ensure adequate input and planning by Indigenous partners in the process. This work is not complete and therefore does not align with IAAC's required timing for commencing work and cost recovery in April 2026.

As IAAC has set requirements and deadlines that do not align with the project schedule, AHP is requesting that the Project be withdrawn from the assessment process.

We would welcome the opportunity to further discuss this approach and collaborate on an appropriate path forward, aligning with the project development plan. Thank you for your understanding and consideration.
