Opportunity for public participation

The Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) is a federal body accountable to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change that delivers high quality impact assessments which contribute to informed decision-making on major projects in support of sustainable development.

Pursuant to the *Impact Assessment Act*, assessment of designated projects consisting of concrete activities governed by the *Canadian Energy Regulator Act*, such as the construction of an interprovincial natural gas pipeline, must be carried out through an integrated impact assessment conducted by a Review Panel. The Agency will work in collaboration with the Canada Energy Regulator throughout the integrated assessment process for the Gazoduq Project.

From January 30th to March 10th 2020, the Agency is inviting comments on the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and the Public Participation Plan. Comments will be documented and taken into consideration to inform the impact assessment process for this project.

Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines

This document provides direction and requirements for the proponent in preparing an Impact Statement. Please consider the following points to assist you in providing feedback, as it will inform the development of this document.

Question 1: Which components of the environment, health, social or economic conditions, be they positive or negative, are important to you and your community?

Question 2: What locations are of importance to you and could be affected by the project?

Question 3: The assessment could incorporate specific knowledge (history, environment, social, economic, etc.) that your community may feel is relevant. What sources of community knowledge would be relevant to the assessment?

Public Participation Plan

This document describes the public participation objectives, the way in which individuals wish to participate and all the opportunities for participation in each phase of the impact assessment process. Please take the following questions into account while writing your comments.

Question 1: Your preferences and suggestions on communication and participation tools that could facilitate your participation. Examples of tools for meaningful engagement include, but are not limited to:

- Public notices
- Public comment periods
- Discussion groups
