Health Canada (HC) would like to correct an error in the July 2020 dated Detailed Project Description for the Suncor Base Mine Extension Project (the Project).

In appendix E, section E-13, page E-29, the Detailed Project Description for the Project incorrectly identifies Intrinsik as currently engaged by HC to develop Health Impact Assessment (HIA) guidance. This is incorrect. While HC previously had a contract in 2019 with Intrinsik to develop a first draft of our HIA guidance document, HC has no current or expected future relationship with Intrinsik as we continue to develop our forthcoming HIA guidance using Health Portfolio expertise.

HC requests that this correction be posted on the Impact Assessment Agency's registry for the Project.
