Subject: Designation Request for the Proposed Castle Project

On May 21, 2020, the Honourable Jonathan Wilkinson, P.C., M.P., Canada's Minister of Environment and Climate Change received a request under subsection 9(1) of Canada's *Impact Assessment Act* (the Act) to designate the Castle Project (the Project) proposed by Teck Coal Limited. The request was made by the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribal Council and the Kootenai Tribe of Idaho. The letter requesting designation and a description of the Project have been posted to the publicly available Canadian Impact Assessment Registry internet site, found at Canada.ca/iaac (Reference 80702).

The Proposed Project

The Project would be located near Elkford, in southeastern British Columbia, Canada and would expand the existing Fording River Operations metallurgical coal mine. The Project would maintain the existing production capacity of 27 400 tonnes per day, and would increase the area of mine operations by 35.7 per cent. The Project as proposed is not described in the *Physical Activities Regulations* under the Act.

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Designation Request

Under subsection 9(1) of the Act the Minister may, by order, designate a physical activity that is not described in the *Physical Activities Regulations* under the Act. The Minister can do this, if, in the Minister's opinion, the physical activity may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or adverse direct or incidental effects (resulting from a federal decision), or public concerns related to those effects warrant the designation.

To support the Minister in considering the request, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) will review:

- information about the Project;
- any concerns expressed by the United States Environmental Protection Agency;
- views of the requesters, Indigenous groups, and the public;
- expert advice from federal authorities;
- input from provincial ministries; and
- input from other key stakeholders such as the State of Montana.

We anticipate that the Minister's determination on whether the Project is to be designated, with reasons, will be posted to the Registry by August 19, 2020.

If designated, Teck Coal Limited would be required to submit formally an Initial Project Description to the Agency, thereby commencing the planning phase of the Act. In that case, the planning phase would include the Agency determining whether a federal impact assessment is required. Should the Project be designated, the Agency will contact you to discuss further steps under the Act.

Seeking Input

The Agency will prepare advice to the Minister on whether the Project should be designated. Consistent with the Agency's guidance on designating projects (link above), when advising and assisting the Minister on the use of their authority to designate projects, the Agency requests input from other jurisdictions. Please email your submission to the Agency by June 16, 2020, using the contact information provided below. Please note that all comments received will be posted on the public Registry.

Important Note: All records produced, collected or received in relation to the designation request process – unless prohibited under Canada’s *Access to Information Act* or *Privacy Act* – are considered public and may be released. If you have provided any comments or documents that contain confidential or sensitive information that you believe should be protected from release to the public, please contact the Agency as soon as possible.
