Subject: Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (IAAC) – end of the Planning phase for the GCT Deltaport Expansion – Berth Four Project

The objective of this letter is to:

- Inform you that the Impact Statement Development and Review Phase has formally commenced; and
- Inform you of the finalisation of key documents from the Planning Phase:

End of the Planning phase and commencement of the Impact Statement Development and Review phase

On October 28, 2021, IAAC issued an Impact Assessment Decision to proceed to an assessment, which initiated the Planning phase for this project. On November 3, 2021 the Minister of the Environment Climate Change Canada [referred the project to assessment by Review Panel](#). During the Planning phase, IAAC worked closely with Indigenous nations, the proponent and other interested parties to develop the final documents listed above.

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On May 31, 2022, IAAC issued a Notice of Commencement for the Impact Statement phase and Joint Permitting/Regulatory Coordination Plan. This means we have begun the Impact Statement Development and Review phase, which has a legislated time limit of three years (up to May 31, 2025). During this phase, the Proponent will collect information and conduct studies, as outlined in the Joint Guidelines.

Next Steps

IAAC would like to hear from the Métis Nation of British Columbia. Please confirm if you would like to set up a meeting to walk through the finalized documents. We will also follow up with more information on the next steps of the Impact Statement Development and Review phase, including engaging with the Métis Nation of British Columbia on the draft Review Panel Terms of Reference and Project-Specific Cooperation Agreement. The cooperation agreement will provide more details about how the Review Panel and/or federal and provincial authorities will work together to address the requirements of their respective legislations, including roles and responsibilities, timelines, sharing of information, and process. The Review Panel Terms of Reference will set the procedures and boundaries of the assessment by the Review Panel. IAAC will also provide information on future funding opportunities related to the Impact Statement Development and Review phase.
