**Please respond by December 9, 2020 using the attached form.**

On November 18, 2020, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) accepted the Initial Project Description for the Heartland Complex Expansion Project (the Project) from Value Chain Solutions Inc. (the proponent) as meeting the requirements of the *Information and Management of Time Limits Regulations* under the *Impact Assessment Act* (the Act). As of today, the 180-day planning phase of the impact assessment has commenced. The Initial Project Description is available on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry Internet site at <https://www.iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/proj/81148?culture=en-CA>.

The Agency has commenced a 20-day comment period (<https://iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/document/136805?culture=en-CA>), inviting the public, Indigenous groups and other jurisdictions to provide feedback related to the Project and to inform the Summary of Issues. All comments will inform the Summary of Issues<sup>1</sup> with respect to the Project that will be provided to the proponent as per subsection 14(1) of the Act.

**Request for comments – Due December 9, 2020**

In accordance with section 12 of the Act, the Agency is requesting the input of the Aboriginal Consultation Office on the Project and potential issues that should be addressed in a federal impact assessment, should the Agency determine that

one is required. Attached is **Provincial Authority Advice Record #1: Authority and Summary of Issues** that the Agency is requesting you complete by December 9, 2020. You may also choose to respond in a different format. Please note, the Agency will consider all comments received in preparing the Summary of Issues. The Aboriginal Consultation Office is encouraged to provide as much detail as practicable in describing the potential issues that may be of relevance or concern in relation to the Project. The Agency encourages you to also provide a concise synopsis of each issue for inclusion in the Summary of Issues.

All comments should be submitted via the *Submit a Comment* feature available on the Project's Canadian Impact Assessment Registry page (Reference #81148 at <https://www.iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/proj/81148?culture=en-CA>). Letters and forms can be uploaded using this feature. If you have any difficulties submitting this way, please contact the Agency using the information provided below for assistance.

**Important note:** All records produced, collected or received in relation to the impact assessment of the Project – unless prohibited under the *Access to Information Act* – will be considered public and will be posted on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry Internet site (Reference #81148). Should you wish to provide any comments or documents that contain confidential or sensitive information that you believe should be protected from release to the public, please contact the Agency before submitting the information. Information marked as confidential will not be accepted without prior contact made with the Agency.

### **Next steps**

Following the provision of the Summary of Issues to the proponent, the proponent will submit a Detailed Project Description in accordance with Schedule 2 of the *Information and Management of Time Limits Regulations*, including how it intends to address the Summary of Issues as per subsection 15(1) of the Act. This notice could be in the form of an annex to the Detailed Project Description wherein the proponent would provide a response to the Summary of Issues provided by the Agency. Following acceptance of the Detailed Project Description, if an impact assessment is required for the Project, the Agency will draft the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines, and the various plans including the Cooperation Plan for review and comment.

The Agency would engage with the Aboriginal Consultation Office on the development of the Cooperation Plan. The Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and plans, which includes the Permitting Plan, the Public Participation Plan, an Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan, and the Cooperation Plan, would be finalized and issued to the proponent on or before day 180 of the planning phase, concluding the planning phase of the Act.
