The purpose of this document is to set out the Agency's preliminary understanding of the potential adverse impacts of the Project on Long Point First Nation's exercise of rights.   - The Project is located within Long Point First Nation's asserted traditional territory.
  - Long Point First Nation is affiliated with Algonquin Anishinabeg Nation Tribal Council and the Anishinabek O Takiwan Committee.
- b) Summary of the preliminary information available to the Agency on the potential impacts to the exercise of Long Point First Nation's rights resulting from any change to the environment due to the Project are identified below:
