  - The Project lies within the Métis Nation of Ontario's James Bay/Abitibi-Temiscamingue Traditional Territory, represented by the James Bay/Abitibi-Temiscamingue Traditional Territory (Region 3) Consultation Committee, as per the Consultation Agreement between the Métis Nation of Ontario and the Government of Canada.
  - The Métis Nation of Ontario have harvesting rights under the Framework Agreement on Métis Harvesting with the province of Ontario.
- b) Summary of the information available to the Agency on the potential impacts to the exercise of Métis Nation of Ontario's rights resulting from any change to the environment due to the Project:
