The purpose of this document is to set out the Agency's preliminary understanding of the potential adverse impacts of the Project on Timiskaming First Nation's exercise of rights. As additional information becomes available throughout the impact assessment process, this document will be updated.

 - Timiskaming First Nation's reserve is approximately 66 kilometres south from the project area.
 - The Project is located within Timiskaming First Nation's asserted traditional territory.
 - Timiskaming First Nation is affiliated with the Algonquin Nation Secretariat (ANS).
- b) Summary of the information available to the Agency on the potential impacts to the exercise of Timiskaming First Nation's rights resulting from any change to the environment due to the Project:

In addition, the Agency would like to meet with your community to discuss the information set out above to better understand how

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your community may be impacted by the Project. The Agency encourages Timiskaming First Nation to share information with the proponent to inform the development of the proponent's Impact Statement.

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
