

Dear Chief Henry Rodgers:

On December 12, 2022, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) received a Detailed Project Description and Response to Summary of Issues from Canada Nickel Company (the Proponent) for the Crawford Nickel Project (the Project). The Agency will review these documents and decide within approximately 10 days whether these items sufficiently meet the information prescribed by the Information and Management of Time Limits Regulations, or whether the Proponent must revise and re-submit these documents.

Next Steps:

On October 17, 2022, the Proponent requested a time limit suspension for the Planning Phase. If the Detailed Project Description and Response to the Summary of Issues meet the information requirements, then the 180-day time limit for the planning phase would resume as of December 12, 2022, the date that the documents were submitted. The Agency will post a notice that the 180-day time limit has resumed and share these documents on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry (Project 83857). Then the Agency will proceed with determining whether a federal impact assessment is required for the Project, pursuant to the Impact Assessment Act.

The Agency would like to meet virtually with Long Point First Nation to discuss how your community may potentially be impacted by the Project. In January, the Agency is available to meet at one of the following dates and times:

- Tuesday January 17 from 1:00-2:00 AM EST
- Wednesday January 18 from 9:30-10:30 AM EST
- Friday January 20 – any time between 9:00AM and 12:00PM EST.

Please feel free to propose another time if you have a preference.
