# Subject: Request for Comments on the Northern Road Link Project

## Please complete and submit the attached form by March 23, 2023

On February 17, 2023, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) accepted the Initial Project Description for the Northern Road Link Project (the Project) from Marten Falls First Nation and Webequie First Nation (the Proponent), as the document meets the requirements of Schedule 1 of the Information and Management of Time Limits Regulations under the Impact Assessment Act (IAA). As of February 21, 2023, the 180-day planning phase of the impact assessment process commenced. The Initial Project Description is available on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry (Registry) at https://iaac-aeic.gc.ca/050/evaluations/proj/84331?culture=en-CA.

The Agency is conducting a 30-day comment period on the Initial Project Description from February 21, 2023, to March 23, 2023, inviting the public, Indigenous communities and other jurisdictions to provide feedback related to the Project and potential effects.

Feedback will help the Agency prepare the Summary of Issues for the Proponent and will inform the Agency's decision as to whether the Project requires an impact assessment. If an impact assessment is required, this same feedback would help the Agency prepare draft planning documents.

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### Northern Road Link Project

The Proponent is proposing the construction and operation, including maintenance, of an all-season multi-use public highway located in northern Ontario. As proposed, the Project would be about 117 to 164 kilometres long and cross the Attawapiskat River. The Project would connect the proposed Marten Falls Community Access Road and the proposed Webequie Supply Road. The highway would become part of a future all-season road network connecting mineral development activities in the Ring of Fire area to the provincial highway system at Nakina, Ontario.

### Request for comments by March 23, 2023

Enclosed with this letter is the **Provincial Advice Record** (Enclosure 1). Enclosure 1 requests information on your ministry's mandate and invites your ministry's comments on the Initial Project Description. This includes your ministry's input on key potential project effects and frameworks for addressing effects, relevant regulatory processes, opportunities to tailor the (potential) assessment requirements, and opportunities to cooperate with other jurisdictions.

Please submit the completed Provincial Advice Record via the *Submit a Comment* feature available on the Project's Registry page. Letters and forms can be uploaded using this feature. Please contact the Agency using the information provided below for assistance. Input received **by March 23, 2023**, will be considered by the Agency in the development of the Summary of Issues.

### **Next steps**

Upon receipt of the Summary of Issues from the Agency, the Proponent will prepare and submit a Detailed Project Description, with the Response to the Summary of Issues that includes an explanation of how the Proponent intends to address the issues raised. Following acceptance of the Detailed Project Description, the Agency will decide whether an impact assessment of the Project is required.<sup>3</sup>

If the Agency decides that an impact assessment is required for the Project, it would draft Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines (Guidelines) and four plans the Permitting Plan, the Public Participation Plan, an Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan, and, the Cooperation Plan—for review and comment.

The comments your ministry provides on the Initial Project Description will inform the decision as to whether an impact assessment is required, the draft Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines, and the draft Cooperation Plan.

The Agency would hold a comment period and would invite you to review the draft Guidelines and draft plans (particularly the draft Cooperation Plan). These documents would be finalized and issued to the Proponent with the notice of commencement of the impact assessment.

During the impact statement phase, the proponent would be expected to complete the required information and studies set out in the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines. At the end of the impact assessment process, a decision is made about if the adverse effects of the Project are in the public interest.
