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## Dear Colleagues:

Subject: Request for Federal Authority Advice on Draft Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines and Draft Permitting Plan for the Northern Road Link Project, by July 21, 2023

On May 23, 2023, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) announced that an impact assessment is required for the Northern Road Link Project (the Project) proposed by Marten Falls First Nation and Webequie First Nation (the Proponent). The Agency has developed the following draft documents:

- Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines (the Guidelines)
- Permitting Plan
- Cooperation Plan
- Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan
- Public Participation Plan



The Agency has commenced a comment period, inviting the public, Indigenous communities, and other jurisdictions to provide feedback on the above draft documents.

As per paragraph 23(a) of the *Impact Assessment Act*, the Agency requests that your department or agency provide specialist or expert information or knowledge to support the development of the draft Guidelines and the draft Permitting Plan for the Project by **July 21**, **2023**. The draft Guidelines and draft Plans are available on the Project's Canadian Impact Assessment Registry page<sup>1</sup> (Reference #84331).

Your department or agency is requested to provide the following:

- With a view to maximizing efficiency of assessment processes, indicate if any corrections, additions, or removals should be made to the draft Guidelines, using the enclosed comment form;
- Verify all regulatory instruments under the authority of your department in the draft Permitting Plan that are anticipated to be required to allow the Project to proceed;
- Verify that the information provided in the draft Permitting Plan regarding the regulatory instruments is correct and up to date; and
- Indicate whether your department or agency has identified any power that it will be unable to exercise to allow the Project, in whole or in part. For more information, see subsection 17(1) of the *Impact Assessment Act*.

When providing feedback, the Agency requests that you consider the approach to tailoring the Guidelines outlined in the Operational Policy Statement: Development of Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines<sup>2</sup>.

More specifically, the Guidelines should focus on key issues, effects and factors anticipated to be material and relevant to a public interest decision, and requirements should be clear and specific. Federal expert advice should be commensurate to the situational context of the Project, and informed by risk-based prudence, with a strong reliance on well-understood mitigation measures, existing guidance, and regulatory instruments that will manage effects.

Your department or agency is also invited to start considering potential complementary measures in respect to the potential adverse effects of the Project. Complementary measures are additional authorities of federal Ministers or federal programs that may be used to mitigate effects that may be beyond the care and control of the Proponent.

The Minister's decision regarding whether the Project is in the public interest would consider complementary measures. The Agency will work with your department or agency during the impact assessment process to identify relevant policies and programs and develop a list of potential complementary measures for the Project.

## **Next steps**

The Agency is required to issue the Guidelines and plans by day 180 of the planning phase (August 20, 2023). The Agency may request further support from your department or agency in finalizing sections of the planning phase products pertaining to your department or agency's authority and expertise.

**Important note:** Please note that any information submitted to the Agency to inform this project assessment will be made publicly available as part of the project file and may be posted online via the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry website (Reference #84331) subject to certain exceptions related to privacy, security or confidentiality.
