Subject: Request for Comments on the Designation Request for the Proposed Port au Port-Stephenville Wind Power and Hydrogen Generation Project (also known as Project Nujio'gonik) under the *Impact Assessment Act*

Thank you for your letter dated June 16, 2023, concerning Project Nujio'gonik (the physical activities referred to as the Project) proposed by World Energy GH2 Inc. You have requested that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change (the Minister) designate the Project under the *Impact Assessment Act* (the IAA).

On April 18, 2023, prior to receiving your correspondence, the Minister received another request to designate the Project. Before initiating its review of that request, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) sought information from the Proponent to confirm whether any of the proposed activities are already described in the *Physical Activities Regulations*. The Agency has determined that the Project is not identified in the *Physical Activities Regulations* and therefore, subsection 9(1) of the IAA can apply.

The Agency has reviewed the original correspondence requesting designation, as well as the correspondence from Miawpukek First Nation, and determined that sufficient information has been provided to commence the designation request process.

The Proposed Project

World Energy GH2 Inc. is proposing to construct and operate a new hydrogen and ammonia production facility along with two new wind farms, all located on the west coast of Newfoundland. As proposed, the Project Nujio'gonik) would produce roughly 140,000 tonnes of hydrogen at the facility located in Stephenville, a year, most of which would be converted to ammonia. Each wind farm (one located on the Port au Port Peninsula and the other in the Codroy

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area) would contain up to 164 wind turbines and produce roughly one gigawatt of renewable electricity. The project would cover a surface area of roughly 4100 hectares and operate for about 30 years.

Designation Request

Under subsection 9(1) of the IAA the Minister may, by order, designate a physical activity that is not prescribed in the *Physical Activities Regulations*.

The Minister may do this, if, in the Minister's opinion, the physical activity may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or adverse direct or incidental effects (resulting from federal decisions, including funding), or public concerns related to those effects warrant the designation. In accordance with subsection 9(4) of the IAA, it is expected that the Minister will respond, with reasons, to the request by October 3, 2023.

Note, as per the limitation of subsection 9(7) of the IAA, the Minister must not make the designation if (a) the carrying out of the physical activity has substantially begun; or (b) a federal authority has exercised a power or performed a duty or function conferred on it under any Act of Parliament, other than the IAA, that could permit the physical activity to be carried out, in whole or in part. The Agency will review information to determine whether substantial physical works have begun, or if a federal authority has exercised a power or performed a duty or function under an Act of Parliament other than the IAA. The Agency will review information about the Project; any concerns expressed by your community, from the public (that the Agency is aware of) and other Indigenous groups; and expert advice and information from federal authorities and provincial ministries to inform the Minister on whether the Project should be designated. If designated, to proceed with the Project World Energy GH2 Inc. would be required to submit an Initial Project Description, thereby commencing the planning phase of the IAA. In that case, the planning phase would include the Agency determining whether a federal impact assessment is required.

Seeking your views

Information on the Project can be found in the designation request letter (attached), and additional information submitted to the Agency by World Energy GH2 (attached). The Agency notes that while some updates have been made by the Proponent to the Project since it was registered for a provincial environmental assessment on June 21, 2022, the registration document for the Project is

The Agency is requesting that you provide responses to the following:

1. Please describe whether and how the potential adverse effects of the Project could result in changes to your community's:
 - (a) physical and cultural heritage (e.g. ceremonial sites, burial sites, cultural landscapes)
 - (b) current use of lands and resources for traditional purposes (e.g. hunting, fishing, trapping)
 - (c) structures, sites or things of historical, archaeological, paleontological or architectural significance (e.g. artifacts, important historic buildings or symbols)
2. Please describe whether and how the Project may result in changes to your community's health, social or economic conditions (e.g. employment opportunities, access to goods and services, economic development, access to health-care services).

Given the 90-day legislated timeline, your response is requested by August 3, 2023.
