Subject: Acknowledgement of receipt of a request for designation of the Ontario Place Spa Complex and Underground **Parking Garage Projects**

Thank you for your letter, dated September 17, 2023, concerning the Ontario Place Spa Complex (the physical activity / activities referred to as the Spa Project) proposed by Therme Canada, and the Underground Parking Garage (the physical activity / activities referred to as the Garage Project) proposed by Infrastructure Ontario. You have requested that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change (the Minister) designate these physical activities under the *Impact Assessment Act* (IAA).

Under subsection 9(1) of the IAA the Minister may, by order, designate a physical activity that is not prescribed in the *Physical Activities* Regulations. The Minister may do this, if, in the Minister's opinion, the physical activity may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or adverse direct or incidental effects, or public concerns related to those effects warrant the designation. In accordance with subsection 9(4) of the IAA, it is expected that the Minister will respond, with reasons, to the request by December 27, 2023.

However, as per the limitation of subsection 9(7) of the IAA, the Minister must not make the designation if (a) the carrying out of the physical activity has substantially begun; or (b) a federal authority has exercised a power or performed a duty or function conferred on it under any Act of Parliament, other than the IAA, that could permit the physical activity to be carried out, in whole or in part.

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The Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) will review information to determine whether substantial physical works have begun for either the Spa Project or the Garage Project, or if a federal authority has exercised a power or performed a duty or function under an Act of Parliament other than the IAA that would permit either project to be carried out.

Upon reviewing your request, the Agency considers the Spa Project and the Garage Project to be distinct proposals with distinct proponents. The Agency is of the understanding that, while there would be a pedestrian link between the Garage Project and the Spa Project, the Garage Project is expected to service the larger Ontario Place complex and is not for the exclusive use of the Spa Project. Further, the Garage Project does not appear to be within the care and control of the proponent of the Spa Project. The Agency will confirm this understanding with the proponent of the Garage Project and responses will be made public. As such, the Agency will consider the Spa Project and the Garage Project as separate projects.

For each project, the Agency will review information; any concerns expressed by the public (that the Agency is aware of) and Indigenous communities; expert advice from federal authorities and input from provincial ministries to inform the Minister on whether the Project should be designated.

If either the Spa Project or the Garage Project were to be designated, in order to proceed with either project, the respective proponent would be required to submit an Initial Project Description, thereby commencing the planning phase of the IAA. In this case, the planning phase would include the Agency determining whether a federal impact assessment is required.

In the coming days, a Registry page for the Projects (Reference 85951) will be available on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry Internet site.
