Please find attached the following documentation which has arisen out of Shell’s Aboriginal consultation on the JPME and PRM Projects.

- Technical reviews completed by Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation (ACFN), Fort McKay First Nation (FMFN) and Mikisew Cree First Nation (MCFN) for the JPME-PRM Projects;
- Shell responses to technical review questions filed by each First Nation group; and
- Relevant meeting notes and presentation slides that were developed for the technical review process.

This information spans the technical review conducted for both the PRM and JPME projects as they were covered under a common Environmental Impact Assessment. Shell anticipates that when a review panel is formed for the Pierre River Mine, this information will also form part of the evidentiary file for this project.

In 2008 FMFN undertook to conduct a community specific assessment of Shell’s projects. This assessment took place between 2009 and 2010 with funding provided by Shell. The comprehensive report that was generated, *Fort MacKay Specific Assessment (FMSA)*, was submitted by Shell to the Energy Resource Conservation Board and to Alberta Environment in June 2010 and is now posted in its entirety on the CEAA registry. While the enclosed submission does not include a full copy of the FMSA, Shell has included relevant documentation and Shell’s responses to specific recommendations made by the FMSA for consideration by the Joint Review Panel (JRP).
